

2nd Quarter Reading Plan

Students: Please go over this information *with your parent or guardian*. And return by due date.

Dear 10th Grade Students:

Now that you've had a whole quarter to get into the routine of reading, it's a good time to reflect on any changes that might need to be made to your reading plan. As you know, students are expected to read the assigned reading (of approximately ten pages) every school weeknight—whether it's a day you had English class or not. Every other night there will be a short response you write in reaction to what was read as homework in preparation for the next day of class. This homework is due the next class day and no late homework is accepted.

You were given a reading calendar to help you stay on top of the reading. Reading and response homework is also posted in the classroom as well as on the class website. It is important that you take ownership for staying on top of the reading so that you don't fall behind and find it difficult to contribute to class activities.

At the beginning of the school year, you made a reading plan with your parent or guardian about where and when each school night you would complete the reading assignments. Please reflect on if the times and places worked well for you as students and parents or guardians. If it did, please write it again on the plan below. If it did not, here's your chance to change it and find a time and place that works. For example, maybe your time and place was 9 pm in your bed...but you found out that you kept falling asleep. That's a sign to shoot for a different time and place. Be sure the times and places selected are free of distractions and are best suited for a consistent habit of active reading.
