

Creating Unity: Repetend, Dear Reader, & End Notes

Because multi-genre writing is unique and non-linear, it requires a lot of work from a reader. You as a conscientious writer do not want to let your reader become confused as they move from genre to genre.

Repetend: is something added to your multi-genre project that repeats or continues.

- The Purpose of repetend is to create unity among the various genre pieces.
- If you provide your reader with reoccurring images or phrases, or a narrative or even a story you will create unity that will help you reader better understand your central theme.
- Include the same phrase, sentence, or image in different genre pieces
- Repeat Genres
 - Begin with a poem and end with a poem
- Repeat and connect themes
- Make sure that your project is going somewhere

Dear Reader

- Create an opening piece that's reader-friendly, informative, and engaging.
- Multi-genre writers must be doubly careful to orient readers quickly and supply information that will help them build meaning the further they read
- Write an introduction that discusses the topic of your paper.
- Tell why you selected your topic and help your reader understand where you will take them.
- Tell your reader things they ought to know before reading.
- **Should be the last thing you write.**

End Notes

- End Notes need to be a new page in your project.
- You need an end not for each genre piece
- The purpose of each end note is to explain each genre piece.
- You should explain what you were trying to accomplish by including each piece.
- You should tell what kind of piece it was.
- Tell the reader what your favorite/ less favorite pieces were
- Each end should be 3-4 sentences. Again the idea is to clarify content for the reader.
